Helpful Information for Art Education (AAE) Students

- Freshman students should try to choose a FSP to meet Community Engaged Learning and/or Gender civic responsibility requirement
- AAE students automatically meet the Race & Ethnicity civic responsibility requirement through AAE coursework
- AAE majors take 4 art history courses which count as one course unit in Social Change in Historical Perspective
- The Art Education (AAE) courses must be taken in sequence: 220, 250, 330, 360, 490 & 492. See bulletin for course prerequisites.
- When registering for art studio courses, remember that art teachers are responsible for teaching a variety of art materials and processes. Try to take courses to ensure you are familiar with drawing, painting, sculpture/ceramics, printmaking, digital photography, fiber arts, and videography/filmmaking/installations.
- Students must enroll in **three** different Intermediate Studio Art Courses (AAV 2XX or 130) from the following list:
 - AAV 130 Photography I (fall and spring)
 - AAV 211 Drawing II (spring)
 - AAV 213 Sculpture I (spring)
 - AAV 214 Printmaking I (fall)
 - AAV 216 Fiber Art (occasional)
 - AAV 217 Ceramics (occasional)
 - AAV 218 Book Arts (occasional)
 - AAV 230 Photography II: Documentary (fall)
 - AAV 231 Studio Lighting: Photo/Video (spring)
 - AAV 234 Darkroom/Alternative Process Photo (occasional)
 - AAV 244 Video I (fall)
 - AAV 251 Design Fundamentals (fall)
 - AAV 252 Typography (fall)

Note: AAE students may qualify for a waiver into a 200-level AAV course that has a prerequisite of "AAV 130 Photo I" if s/he did not take the course & a minimum grade of B was earned in AAV 140 4-D

- Students must enroll in at least **three** advanced studio art or art history courses (3XX-level). A minimum of **two** different Advanced Studio Art Courses (AAV 3XX) must be taken from the following list:
 - AAV 311 Drawing III (fall)
 - AAV 313 Sculpture II (fall)
 - AAV 314 Printmaking II (spring)
 - AAV 315 Painting II (spring)
 - AAV 330 Photography III: Image and Narrative (fall)
 - AAV 331 Advanced Projects in Photo and Video (spring)
 - AAV 340 Video II (fall)
 - AAV 342 Installation, Performance and Media (spring) (prerequisites may be waived by instructor)

Note: Independent Study courses do not fulfill the AAV 3XX requirement. AAV 370 Special Topics courses may meet the advanced studio requirement, but approval must be granted by the AAE coordinator prior to registration.

- Art Ed Students must meet the State Health & Physiology requirement for certification. Students need to take a biology, nutrition, anatomy & physiology, health/wellness issues, personal/family/community health, or BIO/SCI 104 course OR a Health and Hygiene test in the TCNJ Certification Office Education Bldg, ext 2396). The test can be taken during the senior Clinical Practice II (student teaching) semester.
